### **Directors Report**

# Educational Program and Practice: Overview of Curriculum, Highlights of play and learning that have occurred in both groups

May has been an exciting month for everyone at HPK. We enjoyed making something special for our Mums in the weeks leading up to Mother's day. We also took the opportunity to read lots of stories about Mums and think about how our Mums are amazing. Our Parent Night was a lovely night for one Special person and their kindy child to connect and spend time together. Outside was especially magical with the fairy lights and music.

Both groups enjoyed our first Incursion for the year. Wildcall Wildlife show is a wonderful way for children to share their prior knowledge, learn interesting new facts and watch the funny antics of the animals. Whether it was the slow moving lizards sticky out their very blue tongues, the turtle who could flip himself back over or the snake that wanted to slither all over her handler....just to name a few. But the best part was we got to gently touch the animals. We also developed our awareness of human impact on animals and what we can do to ensure the safety of animal habitats.

After watching the children over the fence for the past few months it was great to finally meet and play with them. Our amazing outdoor space is the perfect place for a picnic and play with many many children. It was also a great opportunity for us to practise our "Friend making" skills and we were very good at this. All Educators could hear children talking to new friends. Unfortunately the Monday group had to postpone their picnic due to weather but they will have a redo soon.

Literacy development through play is a major element of our program. All children are exposed to a variety of texts throughout the day. We always make time for group story times and well as small group and individual experiences. Educators ask questions to develop a deeper understanding of the meanings in stories, encourage engagement with words and to connect to our prior knowledge and experiences. The Monday group have enjoyed listening to Pete the Cat and focused on the message that whatever happens you need to keep trying "No matter what you step in, keep walking along and singing your song because it is all good". The Friday group have enjoyed reading Wombat Stew and retelling it in many ways. During their Outdoor learning day the group came together to role play the story and discovered that they could be the story tellers.

Interestingly...both group have had lots and lots of play based around natural disasters! There have been many volcanic eruptions, twisters and Tsunamis occurring at kindy. We have explored these topics using books and technology. We love watching real volcanoes erupt and the lava creep down the side of the mountains.
